## COMMUNITY

Purposeful interactions build community engagement.

## RE-USE

Books are meant to be read multiple times and old books can have new lives. Passing along books no longer in use allows others to enjoy them.

## CHOICE

Children should be able to choose what they want to read and have plenty of options.

## DISCOVERY

Books act as windows and mirrors. Kids should see themselves reflected in the characters they encounter, discover unknown worlds, and find new ideas in the books they read.

## ACCESS

There should be zero barriers to book access. We give books away so cost no longer acts as an obstacle to ownership.

## OWNERSHIP

Children should have lots of books in their homes: books they want to read now and books to savor for later. Everyone deserves to own books that they want to read.


## The mission of Brooklyn Book Bodega is to increase the number of 100+ book homes for kids 0-18 in NYC

Brooklyn Book Bodega provides access to and ownership of books, builds community, and creates a passion for learning through free events and literacy-based community programming.

## Why Books?

Children who do not read on grade level by the end of third grade are four times less likely to graduate high school on time. ${ }^{1}$

Early literacy is a strong indicator of later life success, yet $61 \%$ of children growing up in poverty do not have access to any age-appropriate books. ${ }^{2}$

## The Cost of a Home Library

For families with competing needs, buying new books is an unaffordable luxury. $\mathbf{2 2 \%}$ of children in NYC live below the poverty line. ${ }^{3}$

The average price of 1 new book is $\$ 18.65$. At that price, it would cost $\$ 932$ to buy a 50-book library. A 100-book library would cost $\$ 1,865$.

By distributing free books, Brooklyn Book Bodega makes home libraries a reality for families in need. In 2021, we distributed 80,072 books, with an estimated value of $\$ 1,490,000$.

## Book Deserts

## Book Deserts: Academic achievement suffers when young learners live where books are scarce.

Research shows that reading to children under 2 impacts their academic achievement when they are 8-11 years old. ${ }^{4}$ Yet, $45 \%$ of kids in our country (including many in NYC) live in book deserts ${ }^{5}$ - places where access to books via bookstores and libraries is limited or nonexistent. ${ }^{6}$

One study found approximately 1 book for every 300 children living in a book desert in a community of concentrated poverty in Philadelphia.?

## More than 80\% of Brooklyn Book Bodega readers at a December 2021 event with our partner, United For Brownsville, said they had fewer than 100+ books at home before the event.

At this December event, Brooklyn Book Bodega distributed more than 1,200 books, with an average of 10 books per recipient. We combat book deserts by helping individuals and organizations grow their personal libraries.
