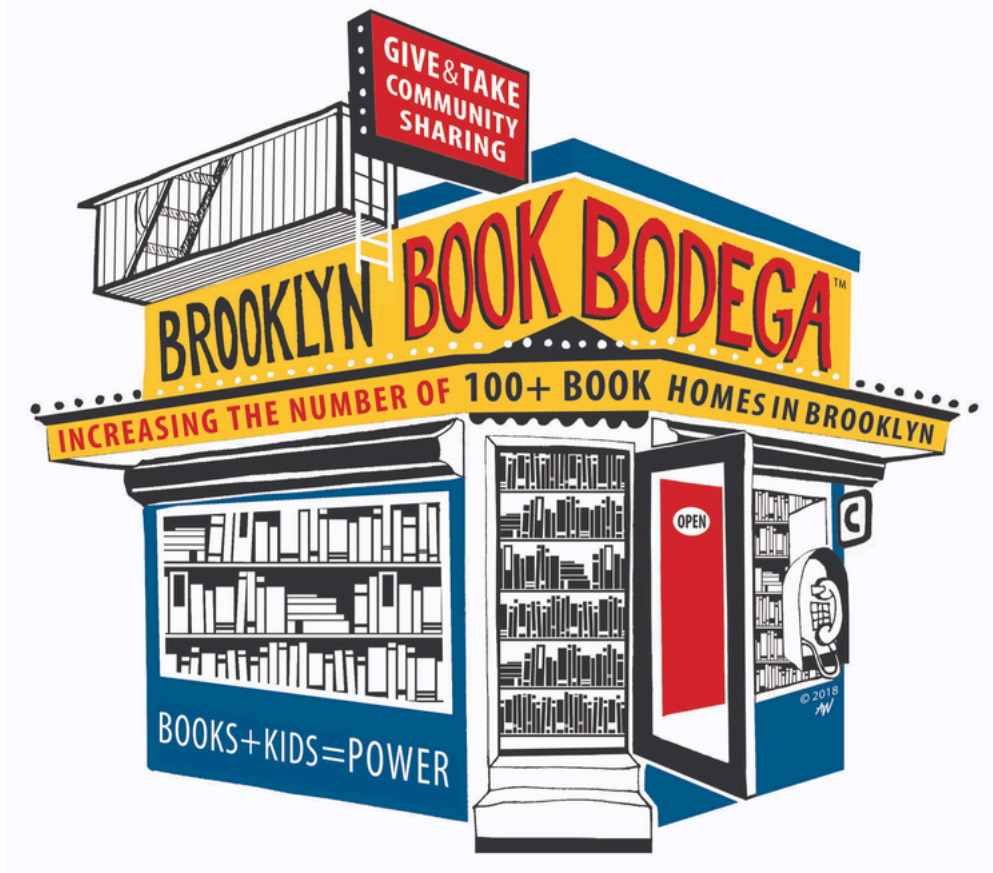

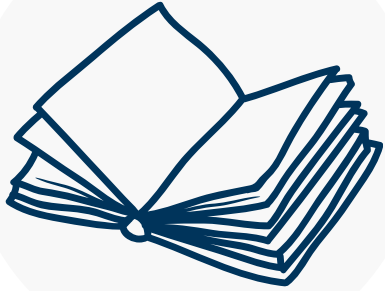
OUR MISSION

The mission of Brooklyn Book Bodega is to increase the number of 100+ book homes for kids 0-18 in NYC.

Brooklyn Book Bodega provides access to and ownership of books, builds community, and creates a passion for learning through free events and literacy-based community programming.

2024 BY THE NUMBERS

January - March 2024



34,778 Books

Distributed to increase book ownership and access for kids 0-18 in NYC.

9,870 Readers

Opened up a world of possibilities by starting or adding to their home libraries.



91 Organizations

Strengthened the work of literacy advocates and supported nontraditional advocates to bring literacy into their communities.

19 Public Programs

Partnered with libraries, community organizations, and schools to create programming, workshops, tabling, and book giveaways.



584 Volunteers

Brought the vision of book access, choice, and discovery to life.

2024 GOAL

Provide 150,000 free books to 30,000 people.

Since our start in December of 2018, we've distributed 426,000 books to 135,000 readers.





OUR IMPACT

There is a student in the classroom next door whose parents told me it was very difficult to get him to read every night. I knew he loved sports and was lucky to find a Golden State Warriors book (he wears a Warriors hat and shoes every day to school). I gifted him the book and his eyes lit up. It was amazing popping into his class and seeing him trying to get a glimpse of his book. His parents texted me telling me he hasn't been able to put the book down.
